**Brussels, 17-21 June 2024**

The Romanian National College of Home Affairs has the pleasure to organise, under the aegis of the European Security and Defence College (ESDC), the **Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP) Orientation Course**, that will take place in Brussels, in a residential format, from 17 to 21 June 2024.

The CSDP Orientation Course is a major component of EU training activities in the field of the Common Security and Defence Policy. It aims to develop and promote a better understanding of CSDP as an integral part of the Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) of the European Union. The course will provide participants with an overview of the civilian and military aspects of European Security and Defence Policy and going into more detail as it unfolds.

The course consists of an eLearning part, as well as a residential session, both parts being compulsory. It will offer an in-depth analysis on Common European Security and Defence Policy, while the participants will have the opportunity to network, share views and perspectives with one another and with professionals in the field of CSDP.

Participants would generally be entry / mid-level staff (police, military, diplomats & civilians) from Member States, EU institutions and agencies, and third countries / international organisations, with some experience in security policy matters.

The ESDC is committed to an inclusive, gender-sensitive and anti-discriminatory environment. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, reach their true potential. We therefore particularly encourage applicants who are likely to be under-represented to apply.

We would kindly invite you to nominate suitable candidates for the CSDP Orientation Course and hence support the accomplishment of the ultimate goal of the course: *providing Member States and EU institutions with knowledgeable personnel able to work in CSDP-related fields.*

## Administrative Information

### CSDP Orientation Course - Brussels, 17-21 June 2024

- **Target group:** The course is open to both civilian and military personnel from EU Member States, relevant EU bodies, CSDP Missions and Operations, as well as international organisations, who are either involved in or designated to work on Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP) matters. Third countries and international organisations are welcome to put forward suitable candidates. We are seeking to put together a balanced group composed of civilians, police and military personnel.
- **Seats & nominations:** A maximum of 45 participants is envisaged. Typically, one seat per Member State / Institution will be allocated. However, depending on the total number of requests, one additional seat could be allocated.
- **Application:** Applications from the EU Member States and EU bodies are to be filed via the ESDC secure internet system ENLIST, by designated nominators, under <https://esdc.europa.eu/enlist/login>, no later than **15 May 2024**. A list with relevant ENLIST nominators can be retrieved from the ESDC website at <https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/>.
- Applications from third countries and international organisations should be sent to the ESDC Secretariat and to [maria-grazia.romano@eeas.europa.eu](mailto:maria-grazia.romano@eeas.europa.eu), by the institution/ organisation that receives this invitation. The application should indicate: the full name of the candidate (as in official documents used for accessing course venue), personal e-mail address (functional mailboxes will not be accepted), nationality, passport number, the validity of the passport, date of birth, institution, reason how this course benefits the applicant.
- Registration will not be final until confirmed by the ESDC Secretariat AND upon completion of the registration form by the nominated participant.
- **Attendance:** Participants' attendance during the course is mandatory on all days. Participants who have completed the full course, including the e-learning modules, will receive a certificate.
- **E-learning:** The course consists of an **eLearning** part to be completed on the ESDC eLearning platform ILIAS before the course starts (17 June 2024). Connection details will be provided in due time to all registered participants.
- **Language:** The working language is English, without translation.
- **Gender equality:** The ESDC strives for a **gender-sensitive and inclusive environment** in all its courses, activities and day-to-day work. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, reach their true potential. We do not and will not discriminate on the basis of race, colour, religion, gender, gender expression, age, national origin, disability, marital status, or sexual orientation in any of our activities or operations. - **Start and end of activity:** The activity will start on Monday, 17 June (13.30) and end on Friday, 23 June (14.00). Please make your travel arrangements accordingly. The programme will be communicated in due course.
- **Additional info:** Course participants will receive further detailed information on the course in due time, including information directly linked to developments concerning travel restrictions or the health situation in Belgium.
