Annex A

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

ESDC Basic Course on Security Sector Reform Chișinău, 30 October-1 November 2024 (Training activity number 24-25/10/2)

- **Target group:** The course is open to both civilian and military personnel from EU Member States, relevant EU institutions and agencies, Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP) missions and operations, and international organisations. The course is also open to non-EU countries and Eastern Partnership countries.
- **Places & nominations:** *A maximum of 50 places will be available for participants from EU countries and non-EU countries (including 15 from Eastern Partnership countries). Typically, two places will be allocated per EU Member State.* However, depending on the total number of requests, one additional place could be provided. We are seeking a balanced group composed of civilian, police and military personnel.
- **How to apply:** Designated nominators should use the ESDC secure internet system ENLIST to submit applications from EU Member States, EU institutions and agencies **no later than 11 October 2024**. Registrations will only be complete once the ESDC Secretariat has sent a confirmation AND the nominated participants have completed the registration form.
All applications from non-EU countries and Eastern Partnership countries (up to 3 participants each, preferably representatives from ministries of the interior, defence or foreign affairs, with priority given to law enforcement experts, as well as diplomats in charge of CSDP/CFSP) should be sent to the Training Manager Laurențiu GIUREA (laurentiu.giurea@eeas.europa.eu), indicating the full name, position, institution, personal email address and phone number, no later than **11 October 2024**.
- **Attendance:** Participants must attend the course **on all days**. A certificate will be awarded on the last day to those who have completed the full course, including the e-learning modules.
The course starts on 14 October 2024 with the e-Learning module. All essential autonomous knowledge units must be completed before the residential module starts. The residential part takes place in Chișinău from 30 October to 1 November 2024 (Wednesday 10.00 to Friday 13.00). The tentative schedule is attached; an updated programme will be distributed before the course starts.
Once the participants' list is finalised, the designated course director/contact person will get in touch with the participants by email.
- **Language:** The working language is English (no interpreting available).



- **Costs:**

The sending country/authority/organisation of participants from EU Member States, EU institutions and CSDP missions/operations, or from international organisations and non-EU countries other than Eastern Partnership countries, must cover all related costs themselves (travel, accommodation and catering/meals; NO course fee is payable).

The course will receive support from the **Eastern Partnership** managed by the European Commission. As a result, all costs relating to participation by Eastern Partnership beneficiaries will be covered by the Commission. As soon as the organisers have received nominations, a selection board will accept and confirm participants. The Commission will then contact the participants to arrange flights and accommodation. Please make sure that each candidate has a valid personal email address.

- **Additional Details:**

The course venue, the programme, dress code, workshop arrangements, lecturers, etc. will be communicated in the practical information after the completion of the selection process.

Dress code: Formal or service uniform for opening and closing ceremonies; smart casual for the working sessions.

Liabilities and insurance: Costs for medical emergencies must be covered by the participant's medical insurance provided by the sending country/authority/organisation. The course organiser does not provide personal health or accident insurance for this course.

Additional info: More information on the course will be sent to participants by email in due course, including any information directly linked to any travel restrictions or the health situation in the Republic of Moldova/the EU.

Course participants should not book their travel, accommodation and meal arrangements until selection has been completed and course participants have been notified that they have been accepted.
